#### **Enrolments for 2020**



## Class Placements

# 2020

As we begin the process of classroom organisation for 2020, I would like to explain what we take into account as we do this.

When considering the makeup of classes we look for:

- · A mix of students' learning abilities, behaviours and dispositions
- · A good gender balance
- · The age range of students
- · Specific needs of students
- · Friendship groupings



All teachers have input into the classroom organisation as they bring knowledge of who works well together, who might benefit from being in a separate grouping etc. Much time and effort is dedicated to getting a good mix for everyone.

If there is any 'specific need' you would like us to take into account for your child's placement then please do email me (principal@stpeterpaul.school.nz) outlining what this might be. We will always take this into consideration when making decisions but cannot guarantee they will be reflected in the final decision. This must take into account the balance and needs of all students. Please do not email with specific requests for particular teachers or classes.

Our roll has all but closed for 2020 enrolments. To ensure that we do not have overcrowding in our junior classrooms we must start the year with most classrooms at their maximum capacity. The Ministry provides a teacher - pupil ratio that takes into account that as children get older and become more independent learners there can be an increase in the class size. As such:

- · Year 4-8 students are staffed on one teacher to approximately 29 students
- · Year 2-3 students are staffed on one teacher to approximately 23 students
- · Year 1 students are staffed on one teacher to approximately 18 students

Some of our year groups are particularly large at the moment. For example we will have 73 students in Year 5 and 67 students in Year 6 next year. The Pohutukawa Area can accommodate a maximum of 120 students. Therefore the structure for 2020 will look slightly different from the last few years. There will be a Year 2/3 class in Room 3 (Kowhai), a Year 4/5 class in Room 11 (Nikau) and a Year 6/7 class in Room 19 (Rata). These classes will be made up of the older year 2s, 4s and 6s and the younger Year 3s, 5s and 7s. There may be some adjustments made because of ensuring we have a good gender mix in the classes, or in special circumstances such as parent decisions around the placement of their twins.

Class information will be included in the envelope that contains school reports and sent home on Thursday 12 December. We thank you for your support in this area as this will make all the difference for a smooth transition.




