I was fortunate to be invited to the Official Opening of Waitangi day which was commemorated with a breakfast in Te Raukura, Te Wharewaka o Poneke, in the Capital City's marae precinct. This event also celebrated Te Raukura's 10th year on the waterfront. My invite came because of our school's involvement in the Kura Ahurea Education Programme, an initiative from our local iwi to assist classroom teachers to teach Te Teo Maori with confidence and to help schools enable their students to progress with their learning of the reo as they move through the year levels.

The programme started as a pilot in 2019 with 7 schools, increased to 23 in 2020 and this year there are 40 schools involved. I felt very proud to hear the name of our school announced as being part of such a worthy initiative.

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

Cell phones / smart watches

Teachers are noticing that some of our younger students are arriving at school with a smartwatch that enables messaging or phone calls. Please note that these fall under the same procedures we have for cell phones:

- They must be put in the classroom minding box on arrival at school and will be returned to the student at the end of the school day
- Failure to follow these procedures will mean the device is removed from the student, sent to the office and parents will be rung to collect the item at their convenience.

Should the school need to contact parents for any reason during the school day you will receive a phone call from the office about this. This very simple process has worked effectively for many decades now and allows parents to feel confident that their child is well looked after during the school day. The widespread use of cell phones has certainly meant schools can more quickly communicate with parents should anything arise. As you can imagine, the main reason for contacting parents during the school day is due to illness or an injury on the playground.

Emergency Contact Form

The oldest child from each family will have brought home an Emergency Contact Form. This is separate from the details we keep on the Student Management System, and require these details at the start of every year. The contacts need to be people who you are happy to pick up your child if the school had to close or a civil emergency. Normally this would be because of adverse weather conditions or an earthquake so please consider who would be able to easily reach the school when completing this form. Please return the form to the school office by the end of this week Fri 12 Feb.
