from the Board

The Board met on the 14 April, it was gratifying to learn that the program Building families of Faith, that has been trialled at our school by Chris Duthie-Jung, will now be offered to all primary catholic schools of the archdiocese.

The six sessions over 3 years aim to engage parents in growing the faith of their children especially in the years leading up to the sacramental program.

Following up on our strategic goal to honour Te Tiriti o Waitangi, a Hui was held in December with the Whanau of the Maori Students at our school. Students and teachers shared the work that has been happening around the school in learning Te Reo and the Kapa Haka group. This was very positively received by the whanau. Other initiatives are being put in place around the NZ history curriculum, working with the other schools in link with our local iwi.

We acknowledge the work the Christian Service Leaders did with Sophie Wright, leading to some very successful events around Easter liturgies and Caritas "Moving Day".

On Anzac day Mrs Senek, Toby and I had the privilege of representing our school community and laying a wreath to honour the soldiers who served in our Armed forces both here and overseas. It was amazing hearing the stories and appreciating that it is so much more than going to war - lots of peacekeepers have lost their lives too. One by one schools and organisations were called up to lay their wreaths on the memorial and then it was our turn... we walked up, laid the wreath and bowed our heads in solidarity for the soldiers. I wore my Great-Grandfather's WW1 and Grandfathers WW2 medals which is a special connection. **By Annie O'Sullivan**



8-11 Nīkau

This term our PE focus is around target games. We are developing accuracy when throwing an object towards a target and we are exploring a variety of techniques including throwing, kicking and rolling. Some of our favourite activities have been Bean Bag Golf and Wall Archery.

We have started this term with a measurement focus in maths. We have been working on estimating lengths of up to a metre. You can help your child find objects at home that they estimate to be 1cm, 10cm, half a metre, and 1m long. Using a ruler, they will be able to show you how they have learnt to carefully measure the objects to check their estimations.

The students have enjoyed looking at them in detail and noticing the interesting patterns and formations of petals, leaves and different shades of yellow. They also viewed the variety of ways artists have captured the image of sunflowers in a visual form. This motivated them to produce their own artistic representation of a sunflower.















RATA COLLAGE SELF PORTRAITS

Rata students have had lots of fun creating and completing some mixed media portraits that show elements of their characters and their thoughts.

'My Head is so Full'

In Rata area, we have been looking at Dada portraits. Dada was a revolutionary art movement created during the First World War. People wanted to bend the 'rules' of art, experimenting with controversial concepts and new ideas. We decided to create our own Dada portraits, exploring our identity, thoughts and emotions through mixed media portraits. We thought about how we saw ourselves, and how we would represent our values and interests. This took some thoughtful planning, and after mapping up our portraits we were ready to begin. We took photos of ourselves and snipped pieces off, cut lines through and cut holes in our photos. We pasted on pictures from magazines, painted designs and drew pictures, resulting in a unique piece of art. Thank you to the amazing Mrs Owen for organising this for us! - *Ruby M*



These portrait illustrations were created through the combination of mixed media-collage, drawing, paint and ink. In the 20th Century nonsense, spontaneity and free thinking were celebrated through the Dada Movement, and this was historical context for the topic.
