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

SWIMMING


Entrants for the South West Zone swimming Sports on Friday 20 August have all been notified.


Great news about the seamless transition back into the new Nikau block, students are thrilled to have their library back in full use.

The change in communication from a written mid year report to learning conferences and school work coming back home has been a new way to share on the learning happening at school.



In the Rata area the math focus has been on angles and measurement. We have been applying this knowledge and understanding to our RE / Art theme which is The Assumption of Mary.

We are creating a collage mural for the church altar, and working on individual designs to adorn the pews. Through looking at the artists - Matisse, Chagall and Michelangelo who are from different periods in art history, we have gained greater understanding of styles and a context to apply the skills learnt. We are using collage technique to replicate stained glass windows.
