Preparedness Planning

We continue with our preparedness planning for managing COVID-19. A public health toolkit, designed to support the Ministry of Education to work with school communities to support the management of COVID-19 contacts within their environments, when a case has been infectious on site, has been provided for all schools. This very useful documents provides a wealth of information and advice including:

Clarity around the various scenarios that would determine if a student or staff member is a close or casual contact

What would happen if a case is confirmed at a school - the steps we would need to take to notify students, staff and families, and anyone else who may have been on our premises at the time

The use of the word 'case' is quite problematic

as it does sound quite impersonal when what we really mean is that a valued member of our community; student or staff has become unwell. Somebody has to be that first 'case' and then the second etc so please know that our prayers and good wishes will always be with you and that quick action to alert us is the most important thing.

With your support, we are already doing many things to further reduce the risk and impact of a COVID-19 case. Now that most children have settled into school we are grateful for your efforts to do drop offs and pick ups at the school gates. It's also very clear to see that people are scanning in and wearing a mask should they need to come on site. Thank you!

Changes for students

The children are amazing at how adaptable they are around these new requirements and it's not just inside the classroom with mask wearing and designated seating etc but out in the playground as well. You may have heard from your children that we have grouped parts of the playground spaces and apart from Kowhai who remain in their part of the school, the other Areas rotate daily around these 3 grouped spaces. We encourage students to see this as an opportunity to play in parts of the school they might not normally have played and to try new games and activities. We are constantly monitoring this and adapting our spaces as needed.

Cell phones / smart watches

A friendly reminder to please follow the below procedures if your child is bringing a Cellphone or Smartwatch to school.

- They must be put in the classroom minding box on arrival at school and will be returned to the student at the end of the school day
- Failure to follow these procedures will mean the device is removed from the student, sent to the office and parents will be rung to collect the item at their convenience.

Should the school need to contact parents for any reason during the school day you will receive a phone call from the office about this. This very simple process has worked effectively for many decades now and allows parents to feel confident that their child is well looked after during the school day. The widespread use of cell phones has certainly meant schools can more quickly communicate with parents should anything arise. As you can imagine, the main reason for contacting parents during the school day is due to illness or an injury on the playground.



We as always will need volunteers to coach and manage these teams.

Trials will be held for Year 7,8 as is outlined in the registration information. Year 5,6 will have their trials if needed completed at school.

These registrations will both close on Wednesday 23rd February at 3pm.

The payment required includes money to pay umpires and the administration fee as outlined above.

Outside School Sport

Unlike music, dance etc many sports organisations go through the schools to access students to enrol in their teams. While we are very keen to support sport at all levels we also have to be sure that we cover our costs as we do not allocate funding from our school budget to cover outside school sport conducted by other groups. Our school budget covers purchase of new equipment, costs related to Zone events, buses to sports events & activities, hireage of facilities etc.

Therefore, as per the previous year, the cost for all our outside school hours sports includes a \$5 administration fee per child. This is to cover the completion of administration tasks for an outside organisation/business which involves, at school level, compilation of registration forms, sending these out, completing team makeups once registrations are received, checking payments, processing payments, all communication with parents on an ongoing basis, attending meetings etc.
