

I had lots of fun doing the sprint race. I tried my best and was so close to making the final. - Jamie




Science

The children have completed the last of their experiments relating to our topic on chemical reactions. Keeping Ourselves Safe

Our health focus this term in the Pohutukawa area is about learning how to keep ourselves safe. We have been following the personal safety programme developed by the NZ Police and Education services. The children have been learning strategies to help them identify when a situation is not safe, who to ask and how to ask for help if they, or someone they know is feeling unsafe. We have encouraged the children to talk with their families about making and following personal, family and school safety rules.



Our Learning Week 4, Term 4

Force, Flight and Motion

In Science, Rata area is learning about the physical world, specifically force, flight, and motion. By making a balloon popper out of a paper cup, a deflated balloon and a small paper cannon ball, we demonstrated Newton's third law of motion, which states that for every action there is an equal and opposite reaction. We launched the paper cannon ball five times, measured the distance and graphed the results.







I discovered that we used force to propel the paper ball out of the cup. We accomplished this by pulling on the balloon that was covering the bottom of the cup. I thought it was a fun experiment that could be used for a variety of purposes. Many other people would enjoy making this as well. - Rishka, Y8
