A Leffer from the Presiding Member

Tēnā koutou katoa,

I trust you were able to have some quality time with your Welcome back to the last term of 2022. I hope that you and your whānau had opportunities for rest and rejuvenation during the October holidays and are ready for a fruitful final term.

The school board met in the last week of term three. It has been fantastic to welcome five new members to our school board. George Jose, Michael Valli and Karen Wong were successful in their nominations to the school board. We have also been fortunate to welcome two new proprietor's representatives, Joey Domdom and Mani Kappen.

Fr Patrick Bridgman, Rau Maxwell, Mike Eglinton, Sarah Gilmour, Kay Tester and I continue as members of the school board.

We look forward to continuing the board work this term, representing our school community.

A huge thanks to Hélène Doyle, Genevieve Greally and Mike Bignall, our school board members that stood down at the election. Their contributions were many, thoughtful and always had the good of all our learners at heart. We wish them well with their new endeavours.

Each board meeting Kay Tester, our Principal, reports on the school progress towards the annual plan. This meeting we were heartened by the ongoing energy and enthusiasm from both staff and students to keep our school's special Catholic character at the forefront of school programmes. The sacramental programme is well underway, and we look forward to our school community coming together to celebrate a school mass on All Saints Day, Nov 1st.

Honouring Te Tiriti o Waitangi is another strategic goal and was a focus of this Board meeting. Our staff have secured excellent opportunities for professional learning and development in the areas of te reo and tikanga utilising the Kura Ahurea kaupapa which provides links and knowledge from a Te Ātiawa ki Te Whanganui a Tara/ Taranaki Whānui perspective. This will enable teaching staff and students to improve their confidence in using their reo and tikanga practice. Kay also provided achievement and assessment data provided for our Y5-6 learners in science. The mean scores for our students were higher than the national averages by a considerable margin and this remained when examining differences in gender and ethnicity. It is a credit to our teaching staff that they are encouraging our students to think like scientists. There has been much work behind the scenes to ensure that science continues to be an area of ongoing professional development.

Our board has also been discussing how best we can engage with you, our whanau, in a variety of ways. With COVID restrictions being reduced, we hope that there will be more opportunities for some face to face opportunities. Next year we will be refreshing our threeyear strategic plan, and as representatives of our school community we are keen to hear what your thoughts are about the strategic direction of the school. As a starting point our current strategic plan is on the school website. We continue to work within the Ministry of Education parameters of the National Education and Learning Priorities (NELPs) as well as guidelines from the Catholic School Education Service. There will be an opportunity to speak to board members face to face at the Celebration of Learning afternoon on Nov 10th, so please look out for us if you're keen to discuss. Wishing you all an enjoyable and learning filled term 4.

Te Awakairangi - A Sense of Belonging

Kowhai created a mural over the past term to capture all the aspects of our learning about 'Our Local Area'. "We sketched the taniwha in the Wellington harbour and then coloured it in, their names are Ngake and Whātaitai. We got some inspiration from Room 4's artwork." – Harry and Indy

"Kupe is in the Wellington harbour with his wife, she named Aotearoa 'Land of the Long White Cloud'" – Riaan and Jack

"We drew houses with all the classes in Kowhai. It was fun. We made trees and cars too for the roads! I liked it because it is colourful, but we don't touch it, we look with our eyes!" - Kaia

Natural Disasters - Earthquakes

In anticipation of the NZ Shakeout next Thursday, Nikau students have been learning what causes earthquakes and how best to keep ourselves safe in the event of an earthquake. We've learnt all about the tectonic plates and tsunamis, all with a focus on what we can do if these events occur. It is important for all families to have arrangements in place and it's a great time to review your plans and discuss these with your children at home. "Earthquakes happen when the tectonic plates of the world rub side to side (transform), crash into each other (converge) or separate from each other (diverge). I also know that earthquakes can cause tsunamis." - Aastha

"Charles Richter invented the Richter Scale. The Richter scale tells us the strength of an earthquake, its magnitude." - Jiya

"The earth's tectonic plates are always moving but we can't feel them unless they crash, pull away from each other or bump together, because they move very slowly." - Indie



All of New Zealand is at risk of earthquakes. Knowing the right immediate action to take can prevent injury and save lives.

In an earthquake, Drop, Cover, Hold. It stops you being knocked over, makes you a smaller target for falling and flying objects, and protects your head, neck and vital organs.

- DROP down on your hands and knees. This protects you from falling but lets you move if you need to.
- COVER your head and neck (or your entire body if possible) under a sturdy table or desk (if it is within a few steps of you). If there is no shelter nearby, and cover your head and neck with your arms and hands.
- HOLD on to your shelter (or your position to protect your head and neck) until the shaking stops. If the shaking shifts your shelter around, move with it.

If there is no shelter near you, crawl to an inside corner of the room and cover your head and neck with your hands and arms. Do not run outside or stand in a doorway. Many people are injured while trying to move DURING the shaking. It is safer to Drop, Cover, and Hold until the shaking is over.

Make a plan today. Find out who can help you and who might need your help. Your local Civil Defence Emergency Management Group has information for your region.
