I hope you have enjoyed reading the Area Information presentations that went home last week. Previously we have held Parent Information Sessions during the early evening, around this time. COVID disrupted that and called for a different approach. A positive result was that all families were able to receive information about how each of the Areas does things and had a handy reference point for people to return to. Therefore we have decided to keep this one going.

School attendance

All the evidence tells us that attending school on a regular basis is extremely important. Every day counts towards a child's learning and pays huge dividends for their future. The importance that you place on regular attendance will make all the difference. Please let me highlight though, how much we appreciate your efforts to keep children home if they are unwell.

Schools have very clear expectations from the Ministry of Education (MOE) about keeping accurate attendance records. Every absence must be followed up and recorded using specific codes. These codes then relate to a justified or an unjustified absence. For example, all medical absences are coded as justified. Holidays during term time must be coded as unjustified. School attendance information is collected by the MOE and a termly report is provided. Our attendance reports are always a focus at Board meetings as we understand the Government's expectations that we prioritise attendance. At the same time we focus on the ways that our school is a welcoming and engaging place for our students to thrive.

Keeping personal track of how many days your child is absent or how many times they are late, will be an important way for us to work together on this. It is relatively straightforward to keep track of your child's attendance at school. You can do this through the @school App or through the Parent Portal. The link to the portal can be found when you scroll right to the bottom of the homepage on our school website. Please contact lisa@stpeterpaul.school.nz if you need any help to access this. Teachers will be in contact should they notice any patterns of absence or lateness arising so we can work together to address this.
