Learning conferences

Our teachers are looking forward to catching up with you again on Thursday 30 March or Tuesday 4 April to discuss and share your child's learning journey so far this year. The face-to-face meeting is by far the most useful but should that option not be possible for you, please ring the office team who will book an on-line time that works best with the teacher's conference schedule.

Should you miss the cut-off, you are still most welcome to ring the office and one will be organised for you from any remaining time slots. Unless in exceptional circumstances, we ask parents to work together before making a booking, so that teachers have only one learning conference for each of their students.

Assessment to improve learning

We use three-way conferencing at the end of terms one, two and three as a mode to present you with clear, comprehensible assessment

information. The term 'three-way' is used to explain that students, parents and teachers are all involved in the process. A role that teachers have during these sessions is to support students and parents to talk to each other about learning and assessment. Obviously what this looks like for a 5 year old is different from an older student but along that journey your children will become more assessment capable, understanding where they are in their learning and where they need to improve. An important outcome from the conferences is that parents are able to talk easily and knowledgeably with their children and the teacher about the learning that is being shared.

An opportunity to engage

With so many parents coming on site over the next two weeks, learning conferences provide a great opportunity for our community to provide input into the direction of the school. A desk will be set up within each of the Areas along with some hard copy forms for you to respond to some questions and then place them in the box provided. We want our future plans to reflect our communities' identities, aspirations and needs so please share your thoughts with us.




The Power of Learning

Amazing Artwork

We are thrilled to share with you some of the amazing artwork pieces Kowhai students have been creating in class. Specifically, we wanted to highlight their self-portrait pieces that showcase their understanding and use of shading, blending, and layering techniques.

The self-portrait topic challenged your children to create a drawing of themselves, paying close attention to the details of their facial features and unique characteristics. They were encouraged to experiment with different shading techniques to add depth and dimension to their portraits. This included using light and dark colours to create highlights and shadows, as well as blending to create a smooth transition between these colours.

Layering was another technique that your children were introduced to during the lessons. They were encouraged to build up their drawings by adding layers of colour, starting with a light base layer and gradually building up darker tones. This helped to create a more realistic and lifelike representation of their features.

Their use of shading, blending, and layering techniques added an impressive level of depth and realism to their portraits.




Ao Te Reo Maori

If your child has borrowed or been given any uniform items from our school office, please ensure that it is washed and returned to us as soon as possible, as our stock is getting very low. Thank you.


