Welcome

A very warm welcome to our new students and families who have joined us since our last newsletter. Kōwhai welcomes Ologa and Eion, Nikau welcomes Milan and Evana, and Pohutukawa welcomes Mia. We hope you have all enjoyed your start to school and feel very much at home here.

Learning conferences

We look forward to our second learning conferences taking place this afternoon and evening. Teachers speak so positively of the opportunity to meet you all and discuss your children's learning journey. Thanks also for the response to our survey. Today you will again find a desk and some hard copy forms available within each of the Areas. If you have a moment please respond to four questions and then place them in the envelope provided. We want our future plans to reflect our communities' identities, aspirations and needs so please share your thoughts with us.

Building work

By the end of the term break we hope to see the school returning to normal as the building project draws to a close. The results of this work are quite outstanding and worth the extra effort involved in being part of a building site. Our Nikau and Kōwhai Areas now have new windows that will provide excellent ventilation for the building. Nikau's old gas heaters have been replaced by heat pumps. New drainage around the Nikau building offers great protection and significant rot in the walls has been removed. As you can imagine with older school buildings, every time they opened something up they found a new problem to deal with. And deal with it they certainly have and our Nikau Area now stands stronger, warmer and dryer.

Teacher Only Day

A further reminder that school will be closed on Monday 24 April for a teacher only day. This is the first of two teacher only days the Ministry of Education has provided for 2023 and 2024 to enable schools to focus on the implementation of the refreshed NZ Curriculum.

Parking around the school

While it is great to be situated in the centre of this lovely city it does provide our community with parking challenges at pick-up and drop-off. The recent road works certainly added to this. Last week these challenging conditions even had local police monitoring driving behaviour around our Myrtle St road patrol crossing. Here are two behaviours we would appreciate you avoiding, even if it may mean adjusting your plans a little:

Please avoid any use of the staff car park. We have had to add an extra job for our road patrollers because of this. As well as setting up for the crossing they now have to put out cones across the driveway to dissuade people from pulling into the carpark.

Please don't pull in and park on yellow lines. Again we have to put out cones to dissuade this kind of behaviour. Apart from the fact it could earn a fine, it does make it very challenging for our road patrollers to have a good view of traffic.

COVID times showed us that finding a spot further from the school and having your child walk or scooter to meet you there proved very successful and many people have kept this practice up. Delaying your pick-up slightly also helps avoid congestion. When we come off road patrol at 3pm there are plenty of carparks available. We appreciate your support with this.

Holy Week

We are now in the most important and solemn of liturgical seasons. Here at school the students are involved in many activities that build their understanding of the significance of Holy Week and the events that occurred. This will culminate in the sharing of a school wide liturgy on Holy Thursday morning. On behalf of all the staff, can I express our gratitude for all your support throughout this term. We wish you a happy and holy Easter and look forward to seeing everyone back on Wednesday 26 April.


SPECIAL CHARACTER

Kowhai has finished this term on a beautiful note! Last Friday we blessed our New Entrants. It was a joyful celebration of our mahi, school values and our growing community.


We are very proud of this term and we are glad that we have been able to share it with our loved ones. Thank you so much for being a big part of our learning journey so far!


Amazing Artwork
