term was 69.8%. Among students not attending regularly, the most common reason for absence was illness.

Students attending 0-70% had the highest proportion of unjustified absence due to a holiday. Our office team is very grateful for all the efforts you make to inform us of your children's absence

and to give a clear reason why. There may be times that you experience difficulty getting your child to school and the reasons for this can be many and varied. Should you see a pattern emerging then please make contact with their teacher or Area Leader who will put in a
