Kia ora Parents and Caregivers, Welcome

Reasons for absence from school

There are some good reasons for being absent from school. For example, keeping your children at home from school when they are sick is important as this stops sickness from spreading, especially in the context of COVID. How long they stay at home depends on what illness they have. The Infectious Diseases table on the HealthEd website describes the symptoms and exclusion periods for some common childhood illnesses.

The Ministry of Education is introducing 3 new measures for the actions schools take to improve attendance. These are designed to show: that schools quickly obtain explanations for

- absences how many students miss more than five full
- days of school in a term that schools intervene quickly before or when students reach this level of absence.

Measure 1: Thanks to your prompt reporting of absences and clear explanations given, we know that we have the first measure well covered. With these new measures in mind, there will no longer be an expectation for parents to present the school with a medical certificate of absence. Rather, we would appreciate you keeping in touch should children be unwell for extended periods of time e.g. more than a full week.

Measure 2 & 3: Attendance information will be another piece of information shared and discussed at the Learning Conferences at the end of the term as we know the impact attendance has on progress and achievement. Prior to this, parents may receive a phone call or an invitation to a meeting to discuss attendance should teachers notice attendance levels dropping.
