CURRICULUM AND INQUIRY

We will continue this term with our overarching concept of 'Power'. A reminder that the 'Big Ideas' we have been relating our learning to are:

- There is power in learning
- Power can be good or bad
- Power is everywhere

Religious Education

Through a range of learning and exploration, the children will begin to understand that the Holy Spirit is present and affects everyone and everything around us. We will help the children to develop an understanding that the Holy Spirit is God, and they will start to identify this in their everyday lives. Some key ideas that the children will be able to identify are how people's actions show the power of the Holy Spirit in and around us as well as how we can all experience the power of the Holy Spirit in our relationships with others.

We are also going to explore the importance of the church in our community and as a Holy place. The children will learn that we all belong, celebrate and are part of a wide community of people who belong to the church. They will be able to identify why it is an important place and how we show appreciation and follow Jesus within it.

Health

We will continue to build our knowledge and put into practice The Zones of Regulation. Our learning in this area supports students to understand and talk about their feelings, look at perspectives and develop strategies which support them to move through the zones so that they become increasingly independent in self-regulating and navigating their feelings and emotions.

Science

Our science focus this term is Rubbish: how do we deal with it? The children will explore the science concepts that underpin how we classify and sort materials that are no longer useful to us. We have had many discussions already about what rubbish actually is and will be investigating it further through scientific experiments. As we engage in this learning at school, it will allow the children to have discussions with you at home about rubbish, connecting it to their own homes and communities.

Social Sciences

Following on from our science learning, in the second half of the term we will take a look at stewardship and the power we have as kaitiaki of Aotearoa, New Zealand. We will be working on how we can make an impact on the planet and its future through taking care of the rubbish we do have. This will be demonstrated at school and at home so please work with your child to make even a small change that will impact Our Common Home.

As we progress with our Structured Literacy approach, we would like to introduce some tools which will allow you to be more involved in our learning. Your child will bring home a bookmark with instructions or goals that they are working on in class. This is not home

learning, but rather an opportunity for you to share the joy of reading together and should always be an enjoyable experience. It could be a reading experience before bed or an addition to your before or after school routine (no more than 15 minutes would be ideal). Your child will not always be able to read the books we send home but would love to hear you read to and with them just as much. We

would also like to stress the importance of returning these books each week as they are a school resource. Please ensure your child has their book bag (see image) at school every day.
